The challenge for leaders and leadership today



Elena P. Antonacopoulou is Professor of Organisational Behaviour at the University of Liverpool Management School, where she leads GNOSIS – a research initiative advancing impactful collaborative research in management and

organisation studies. Her principal research expertise lies in the areas of organisational change, learning and knowledge management with a focus for leadership implications.

Lessons from hosting and hospitality: Harry Murray MBE in conversation with Mark McKergow

Harry Murray has been described as 'the doyenne of British hospitality'. With a lifetime of experience in the hotel business, Harry has many valuable insights – about what makes a great host, how hosting and leadership come together, and many practical insights about how small things can make a big difference. He contributed to the *Host* book and continues to support and build the importance of hosting and leadership.



Harry Murray MBE is Chairman of Lucknam Park Hotel & Spa near Bath. He is a member and past Chairman of Master Innholders, and was awarded an MBE in 2005 for services to the hospitality industry. Other accolades include a 'Catey Lifetime

Achievement Award' in 2008 – chosen by his peers for his outstanding contribution to the hospitality industry – and 'Hotelier of the Year' in 1986. He was awarded the AA Life Time Achievement Award, 2013-14.

Progressing nurse leadership through Host engagement with Annessa Rebair

Welcome to an introduction to the idea of using Host Leadership as a candidate to progress nurse leadership in health care and in particular within teams. Annessa Rebair MSc BSc (Hons) RMN, Cert Ed has 20 years' experience in mental health nursing across various clinical settings working laterally as a Matron for acute services in the NHS. Annessa is a qualified ILM Executive and Leadership coach and

provides coaching to staff across a variety of organisations including university, NHS and private health care providers.

Annessa currently occupies a role as Senior Lecturer at Northumbria University and is a Board Trustee for the national

charity PAPYRUS (prevention of young suicide) she leads nationally on this subject for the Royal College of Nursing and is undertaking Doctoral research in this area.

Host Leaders as good citizens in software development organisations with Pierluigi Pugliese (Germany)

Over the last years the software development world has experienced a revolution by realising how human factors are an important factor for successful projects. Part of this revolution is based on a close co-operation among the various figures involved in crafting products: in this scenario Host Leadership is a great metaphor for promoting and supporting co-operation.



Pierluigi Pugliese started hacking code so long ago that he cannot remember exactly when anymore. He worked many years in the mobile telecommunication business, both as programmer and as a team leader, providing

software for several mobile phones of known brands. Currently he works as a consultant for software organisations and coach for individuals and teams, focusing on software development and software processes, helping them implementing sound and agile solutions. Pierluigi is based in Munich and operates through his company Connexxo.

Mind the gap! The dynamics of stepping back as well as stepping forward in a busy organisation with Helen Bailey

Host Leaders know when to step forward – and when to step back. In this session Helen Bailey will explore the dynamic nature of Host Leadership, how it includes both action and reflection and links to both masculine and feminine 'traits'. The practice of stepping back and reflecting seems often to be undervalued – connecting with some of the 'feminine' aspects of Host Leadership can help us to bring the value and skills of reflective practice, listening, creating space.



Helen Bailey is co-author of Host: Six new roles of engagement for teams, organisations, communities and movements. She is a seasoned coaching and change expert and previously held a successful senior management position with The Royal Bank

of Scotland Group. In 2004, she started PINNA Ltd where she is Head of Coaching and in 2010, completed her Masters degree in Developing Professional Practice where her research interest was collaboration.

Workshops

The Host Leader: Open hearted, even handed, clear thinking with Stephen Josephs (USA)

There is a saying: The one who says it can't be done shouldn't interfere with the one who is doing it. Often these two characters, the doubter and the doer, exist in the same person. We experience this as ambivalence. By moving past ambivalence and whole heartedly embracing the role of Host, we focus and perform beautifully. In this hour we will learn practical techniques for reclaiming the energy bound up in self-doubt, and its twin, overconfidence. What remains is clear eyed, open hearted hosting – spontaneously generous and practical.



Stephen Josephs, Ed.D., is co-author of Leadership Agility, and author of Dragons At Work. In his 37 years in executive development he has coached leaders in scores of companies. For over fifty years has had a daily practice of mind-body

disciplines (meditation, martial arts, qigong, tai chi). Stephen applies these arts along with his knowledge of business to help leaders bring out people's best work in new ways – ways that represent the leader's next step in his or her personal evolution. Stephen is also a gifted musician and often uses music along with liberal doses of humor to enhance learning in his workshops. He lives in New Orleans with his wife, son, daughter-in-law and three grandchildren.

From Stewarding to Host Leading: Engaging in an online community of practice with Leah Davcheva (Bulgaria)

The Pestalozzi Programme (Council of Europe) supports a community of practice of education professionals and offers a moderated online space for professional development across Europe. The platform now has 1,700 members from across Europe, sharing their expertise, vision and practices. The people who hold it together and take care of its moderation are a team of ten "stewards".

In this workshop I discuss my two-year experience as one of the stewards on the platform with reference to the tools and ideas of Host Leading. I begin the session by setting the context and then present the ways in which the Host Leadership metaphor has made a difference to the way I view my practices as a steward, how it has affected my linguistic expression and has driven me to modify the ways I perform online. I then invite the participants to look at some of the possibilities the metaphor opens for understanding online hosting, share their thoughts and make sense of some hot issues together.



Leah Davcheva, PhD, is the founder and director of AHA moments – Centre for Interculturality, Solutions Focus, and Host Leadership. She is an international trainer, coach, researcher, and co-author of books, articles, and online learning materials.

Influencing as a Host Leader with Mike Brent

This session will focus on the concept of influencing as a key part of the Host's role. Mike will examine what influencing means, how it differs from persuasion and convincing, why it is an important leadership skill, how it links to Host Leadership. He will also look at four key approaches to influencing as well as looking at some key tools and techniques.



Mike Brent is a member of Faculty, Professor of Leadership Practice, Client and Programme Director at Ashridge Business School. He specialises in leadership, team-building, influencing, coaching, cross cultural management, leading change and

personal development. Mike has a particular interest in working with management teams and has worked with many companies and organisations all over the world. His particular interest in influencing, leadership and manager-employee relations (including manager as coach) have led him to write numerous articles and has co-authored four books with Fiona Dent for FT Publishing on leadership, influencing, coaching and teams.

How Hosting embraces complexity and uncertainty with Dr Mark McKergow

One of the key elements of good hosting and Host Leadership is responsiveness. However much we plan, the unexpected will happen. The question then is – how do we react as leaders? We can see how complexity and uncertainty works through different lenses including complexity and jazz. Mark McKergow will be showing how responsiveness is deeply woven into Host Leadership, and how this element comes through in the different roles of Host Leaders. We will be working with real-life examples and challenges so please bring your questions and ideas.



Mark McKergow PhD MBA is a consultant and author bringing new ideas into the world of organisations. He is director of SFWork, the Centre for Solutions Focus at Work, based in London. He is the co-author of the best-selling The Solutions Focus book which

has sold some 30,000 copies and is in 11 languages. His latest book (with Helen Bailey) is Host: Six new roles of engagement for teams, organisations, communities and movements (Solutions Books, London, 2014). He is a visiting research fellow at the University of Hertfordshire and edits the SFCT journal InterAction.
